

PLANT CARE

BLOOMING

LIGHT

Place in bright, indirect sunlight and remember to rotate your plant periodically to allow for even light distribution. Avoid direct sun to prevent petal burn, as well as very low light to avoid leggy growth or the decline of lower branches.

TEMPERATURE

Keep at room temperature (65-80° F) away from drafts and vents for best growth.

WATERING

When the top 1/2" of your plant's soil becomes arid or begins to pull away from its container, evenly soak the soil's surface using a watering can, or place your pot in a water-filled plant tray for 20-30 minutes to allow the roots to wick water upward. Do not allow to dry out completely. If decorative pots do not feature a drainage hole, remove plant and empty excess water immediately after watering.

ONGOING

Cut and remove old or dying blooms to encourage new floral sets. As blooms fade and chance of frost has passed most perennial specimens can be planted outdoors. Do not transplant or re-pot while plant is in flower.
